Ingersoll Remodel Nearing Completion

Transformation of the old War Lab space in IN-157 into offices for the Tier2 **Technology Assistance Center** staff is nearing completion. Rooms IN-115 - 118 are also being remodeled. ITACS staff will be moving into the new spaces in early November.

All ITACS staff will be moved out of their current locations in Herrmann Hall by the end of November, so that restoration of the historic East Wing can be accomplished. **Business Solutions Group** staff and **Academic and Client Services** staff will be relocated into Ingersoll, Spanagel and Glasgow Halls. During the moves, response time for calls will be extended, as ITACS personnel will be doing much of the relocation on their own.

- On October 13, an article about the NPS 50th Anniversary in Computing was submitted to **CHIPS**, the DoN CIO's quarterly journal, by **Barb Honegger**, Senior Journalist from PAO.

- A teleconference with the **WASC Substantive Change Committee** was held on October 14, 2004. **Provost Elster** led the NPS team: **Dr. Christine Cermak**, **Tracy Hammond**, **Tom Hazard**, **Dave Floodeen**, and **Dr. Maxine Reneker**. The petition for Sub Change to WASC requested authority to initiate additional VTE programs and authority to initiate web-based programs. The first web-based program proposal was the **Master of Computing Technology** through the Department of Computer Science -- this proposal was approved by the NPS Academic Council in August 2004. The meeting went well; WASC notified NPS that the petition was approved by the review team and that formal notification from WASC would be sent within 30 days.

CS managers attended **EDUCAUSE**, the premier IT national event in higher education, from 19-22 October. The theme for this year's meeting was *IT From a Higher Perspective*. **Dr. Gil Gonzales**, CIO at CSUMB, and **Dr. Christine Cermak** gave a presentation on October 21 titled **Monterey Peninsula I-Net: Building Regional Infrastructure through Partnerships**. EDUCAUSE is the largest higher education information technology professional association.
