#### **PYTHON** Enhancements

Programmers Kamil Marcinka and Chris Webb, contractors for eDataTech, came onboard NPS in January to form a new PYTHON Support Team to enhance the PYTHON application. Their first task was to analyze over two hundred enhancement requests that had accumulated since the deployment of PYTHON. Requests were organized and put into priority order before implementation began. Their goal is to improve the usability and functionality of PYTHON, by tracking and addressing enhancement requests made by users. The PYTHON Support Team also addresses any technical issues that require immediate attention.

Currently, the team has completed a total of 126 enhancements. Some of the changes involve fixing minor code issues; others give the users new or redesigned data views, or implement new business processes. Users can see up-to-date tallies along with a list of selected notable enhancements on the new "Recent Changes" page accessible from within PYTHON. The Streaming Media Project update was submitted 15 November to the **IT Task Force**. Goals of the project are to capture live data streams of classes/events and make them available via IP or Web. Plans call for storage of streamed classes for video on demand (VOD) as well. Video production is not within the scope of the project.

#### **Instructional Technology**

**Tracy Hammond** presented the Instructional Technology Plan to the IT Task Force, which endorsed it. This plan, initially developed by **Professor Jeff Knorr** in 1999, is based on the University of Wisconsin model; it includes a detailed classroom inventory of physical as well as technology conditions.

#### Web Redesign Project

Proof of concept technical reviews for content management systems have been received from Percussion and RedDot.

#### **High Performance Computing**

The NPS HPC Committee is moving ahead with hiring a HPC Technical Manager. NPS hopes to develop a partnership with the DoD Modernization Program to assist in funding the position. Current funding is from the **Dean of Research**.

#### Director of Institutional Research Selected

Following a national search, **Dr. Fran Horvath** has been appointed Director **of Institutional Research**, reporting to **Dr. Cermak**. Dr. Horvath, current Director of IR and Planning at CSU Northridge, earned her Ph.D. from USC and has extensive assessment and accreditation experience. She will begin work at NPS on December 6. Her office is on the first floor of the Dudley Knox Library.
