#### **DoDNet**

RDML Patrick Dunne signed the Memorandum of Agreement on 2 January to officially establish the Monterey Peninsula Department of Defense Network (DoDNet). Other signatories were Robert Brandiewie of DMDC, CDR Gary Kreeger, Acting Commander of FNMOC, COL Michael R. Simone, Commandant of the Defense Language Institute Foreign Language Center, and Dr. Simon Chang, Superintendent of Marine Meteorology, NRL. Fred Cohn, Deputy City Manager and CIO of Monterey represented the City of Monterey, which furnished the fiber optic strands that serve as the DoDNet infrastructure. Dr. Christine Cermak, NPS's CIO, also attended. DoDNet is a communication infrastructure that links the DoD properties in the Monterey area. The project was a joint effort by NPS, FNMOC, NRL, DMDC and DLI to increase their operational efficiency and reduce the costs of communication. ITACS' Hank Hankins and Bill **Hogan** were instrumental in design of the network.

#### IT Task Force

**Dr. Doug Brinkley** shared the report of the **E-mail Protocol Committee** at the IT Task Force meeting on 25 January. The Committee's recommendations for revisions to current e-mail policies were endorsed by the full IT Task Force, and referred to ITACS:

- Add more network storage to facilitate multitiered quotas for mailboxes (up to 1GB for current full time faculty);
- 2. Store attachments outside the users' mailbox;
- 3. Implement a VPN to give users remote access to their H: drive and to their archived mail.

#### **Digitization Committee**

The NPS Digitization Committee, which was chartered to evaluate ways to improve productivity and eliminate paper waste on campus, briefed the Faculty Council Executive Board on 24 January. Dr. Maxine Reneker, Stan Bush, Thomas Housel, Stephen Hurst, Chris Eagle, Gary Kramlich, Don Lincoln, Joe LoPiccolo, and Roger Lord serve on the Committee. Recommendations included both short

and long term remedies, starting with use of collaborative tools and electronic distribution of informational materials, and ranging to fee-for-service copiers and free scan-to-e-mail. **Baseline metrics** are now being gathered to gauge current paper use, and a **customer survey** will be used to gather information on users' preferences for thesis and coursework.
